



## Not just a pretty picture....

Saxtead Parish Council had the opportunity to use a thermal imaging camera to capture images of heat loss in properties in January 2024. We were delighted with the response as 27 residents signed up. Please see a few examples of what we found.












Shows the location of a window and a door that actually didn't exist!
Historically they would have been there, but the insulation wasn't good enough in these locations




Shows a conservatory with effective triple glazed windows - but see the heat loss in the uninsulated base



Shows the efficiency of a thatched roof but the heat loss through a single glazed window (especially where there is a radiator right beneath!)

## Recycling at home - Compost

Creating your own compost at home is an easy way to deal with kitchen scraps, garden waste and at this time of the year, falling autumn leaves. It reduces the amount of waste we send to landfill, is a wonderful way to create lots of different habitats for wildlife and saves money avoiding the need to buy (plastic) bags of compost and soil improvers. A compost heap is a great way to encourage more wildlife into your garden. It creates a refuge and feeding area for creatures such as hedgehogs, beetles, toads, bats, and birds. Many of these eat insects and slugs and therefore act as natural pest controllers, reducing the need for pesticides and other chemicals. Using compost in



your garden will help lighten heavy clay soils, improve water retention of light soils, feeds plants, and help control diseases.
